Disp. and Deed of Gift by Mary Douglas Malcolm or Palmer Douglas - To Trustees for Denholm Feuars and Householdiers Council.

I, MRS MARY DOUGLAS MALCOLM or PALMER DOUGLAS of Cavers in the County of Roxburgh and residing at Burnfoot, Langholm, heritable proprietrix of the subjects hereinafter disposed, CONSIDERING that for some time past being desirous of making provision for recreation and the amenity of the inhabitants of the village of Denholm I have set aside certain areas of land in the said village for the use of the said inhabitants with the view of conveying the said areas to the Council duly appointed by the Denholm Feuars and Householdiers as a gift from me to be held in perpetuity under the Council's control and management, THEREFORE and without any money consideration being paid therefor I DO hereby GIVE, GRANT, CONVEY and DISPOSE to THE REVEREND JOHN WALLACE ROSS, The Manse, Denholm, Chairman, ANDREW HADDON, Solicitor, Honeyburn, Denholm, Vice-Chairman, and GEORGE HENRY WADE, Licensed Victualler, Cross Keys Inn, Denholm, Secretary, all of the Denholm Feuars and Householdiers Council, as Trustees for the said Denholm Feuars and Householdiers Council and their successors in office duly appointed in accordance with the Rules and Regulations governing the said Council heritably and irredeemably ALL AND WHOLE those areas of land (Eight in number) lying in the Town or Village and Lands of Denholm in the Parish of Cavers and County of Roxburgh, conform to and delineated and coloured pink on the plan or tracing from the Ordnance Survey Sheet of the said Parish annexed and subscribed as relative hereto, which areas of land are at present occupied and used by the inhabitants of Denholm as a public green, recreation ground, bleaching green, loanings and public accesses respectively and form part of the lands and barony of Cavers in the County of Roxburgh particularly described in a Disposition and Deed of Entail made and executed by me with consent in favour of myself and the other heirs therein mentioned dated the Twenty seventh day of July and recorded in the Register of Tailzies on the Twenty sixth day of October and in the Division of the General Register of Sasines applicable to the County of Roxburgh for publication and also as in the Books of Council and Session for preservation the Thirteenth day of November Eighteen hundred and eighty: WITH ENTRY as at the Twenty fourth day of August Nineteen hundred and forty
